The examination consists of 50 questions based on Rules 1-10 and the Mechanics section of the ASA Official Rule Book. Questions are true or false and multiple choice. Answers should be put on the answer sheet and returned to the grader or test committee. THE ANSWER SHEET SHOULD NOT BE RETURNED TO THE ASA NATIONAL OFFICE.

The abbreviations used in the questions follow the following: B (N) = Batter; R1 = runner closest to home; R2 is the succeeding runner; R3 is the runner on first base when the bases are full; S (N) = substitutes; CR (N) = courtesy runner(s); PC (N) = physically challenged player; and F (N) = fielder by number. F1 is pitcher; F2 is catcher; F3 is first baseman; F4 is second baseman; F5 is third baseman; F6 is shortstop; F7 is left fielder; F8 is center fielder; and F9 is right fielder. If F10 is used it would be the extra fielder in the slow pitch game.

This examination may be given to all ASA registered umpires under one of the following methods to be determined by your local state/metro ASA commissioner, local umpires association, local parks and recreation department, or military sports officer:

- 1) Under supervision without the use of the ASA Official Rule Book.
- 2) Under supervision using the ASA Official Rule Book.
- 3) With no supervision and using the ASA Official Rule Book.

2012 General Questions - True or False

1. As R1 races toward home plate F2 blocks the plate causing R1 to slow down resulting in R1 being tagged out. The umpire rules that F2 is legally blocking the plate because F2 was about to receive the ball.
2. With no outs and R1 on first base, B2 hits a grounder to F4 who attempts to tag R1 but R1 reverses directions and runs back to first base. The umpire rules a dead ball and R1 out.
3. No run can score on the third out of an inning when the preceding runner is called out on an appeal for failing to touch a base.
4. With no outs, R1 on second base and R2 on first base, B3 hits the ball up the middle for a base hit. An errant throw to F2 allows R1 to score. F2 retrieves the ball but the on-deck batter interferes with F2 who is attempting to tag R2. The umpire rules a dead ball at the time of interference, R2 is out and B3 must return to the last base touched at the time of the interference.
5. A blocked ball is a batted, pitched or thrown ball that is touched, stopped or handled by a person not engaged in the game, or which touches loose equipment or any object that is not part of the official equipment or official playing area.
6. The base line is a line directly between a base and the runner's position at the time a defensive player is attempting to tag that runner.
7. In cold weather, a player puts a warming sleeve on a bat. The umpire should allow usage of that bat because the warming sleeve did not change the characteristics of the bat as produced by the manufacturer.
8. (SP ONLY) If the umpire mistakenly allows two intentional walks at one time and the first batter fails to touch first base, an appeal shall be honored on the first batter.
9. (SP ONLY) The pitcher must come to a full and complete stop with the ball in front of the body. The front of the body must face the batter. This position must be maintained at least two seconds before starting the delivery.
10. Interference is the act of an offensive player or team member, umpire or spectator that impedes, hinders, or confuses a defensive player attempting to execute a play. Contact is not necessary.
11. (SP ONLY) If the EP is used, the team may drop down to 10 players and go back to 11 players as many times as they have legal substitutes.
12. A bat with an axe-shaped handle is legal in all divisions of ASA play.
13. A substitute may be reported by the manager to the official scorekeeper or to the plate umpire.
14. Obstruction is the act of a defensive team member who impedes the progress of a runner or batter-runner who is legally running the bases and that fielder is fielding a batted ball.
15. (SP ONLY) A limit of six (6) over the fence home runs will be used in Co-ed Open and Women's C Slow Pitch.
16. It is not interference if a runner intentionally hits a deflected batted ball with their elbow while running the bases.
17. When there is spectator interference, the ball is dead, the batter and all runner(s) are awarded the bases they would have reached had the interference not occurred.

18. The batter becomes a runner on ball four.
19. A runner is out for interference even if that runner accidentally contacts a fielder attempting to throw the ball.
20. Wooden softball bats manufactured prior to 2000 may be used even though they do not bear the ASA Certification Mark
21. If a batter swings at and misses the pitched ball but accidentally hits it on the follow through, the umpire should:
- A: Allow the play to continue.
 - B: Declare "foul ball" as the batter was still in the batter's box.
 - C: Rule the ball "dead," call a strike on the batter and return all runners to the base they occupied at the time of the pitch.
 - D: Declare "catcher's obstruction."
22. (SP ONLY) The pitcher delivers the pitch with excessive speed. The umpire rules:

- A: The pitch is ruled a ball or strike depending on its location.

 - C: Dead ball, an illegal pitch called and a warning issued to the pitcher.
 - D: Dead ball, no pitch and a warning issued to the pitcher.
28. B1 hits a ground ball to F6. F6's throw causes F3 to jump to catch the ball and land on the contrasting color portion of the base. B1 collides with F3, who is still on the contrasting color portion of the base.
- A: F3 is guilty of obstruction.
 - B: There is no obstruction and B1 is safe because F3 did not touch the white portion of the base.
 - C: B1 is safe because F3 did not touch the white portion of the base and the defensive team must appeal the play.
 - D: B1 is out because the throw pulled F3 into foul territory causing F3 to come down on the contrasting color portion of the base.
29. Smith is injured and replaced in the line-up by a legal substitute, Jones. Two innings later, Smith attempts to re-enter for Jones.

- A: B2 is declared out for interference; R1 remains at base.

41. (SP ONLY) The plate umpire should go "set" when the ball reaches the highest point of the pitch's arc.

ALTERNATE FAST PITCH ONLY QUESTIONS - True or False

8. (FP ONLY) With R1 on first base and B2 in the batter's box with a count of 1-ball and 1-strike, B2 takes a called strike as R1 attempts to steal second base. Out of frustration on the called strike, B2 accidentally drops the bat as F2 makes a play on R1. As F2 steps forward on the throw F2 trips over the bat and cannot complete the throw. The plate umpire calls a "dead ball," rules B2 out and returns R1 to first base.

9. (FP ONLY) With one out and R1 on first base, B3 receives a “base on balls” and R1 advances to second base but over runs the base and is tagged out. The umpire rules R1 safe since R1 advanced as a result of B3 being awarded a base on balls.
11. (JO FP) The DP draws a walk and the FLEX, who is the pitcher, is entered to run for the DP. The coach then asks the umpire to enter a Courtesy Runner for the FLEX who is now on first base. The umpire informs the coach that this is not possible because the FLEX did not bat for themselves.
15. (FP ONLY) A pitcher picks up dirt with the pitching hand and does not wipe the dirt off before pitching. This is an illegal pitch.
22. (FP ONLY) The batter fouls the pitch directly to F2’s chest protector. F2 gains possession of the ball before it touches the ground.
- A: This is a foul tip.
 - B: This is a blocked ball.

26. (FP ONLY) On ball four, the Look Back Rule shall be in effect for all runners when:

36. (JO FP with a time limit) B1 is at bat in the bottom of the sixth inning with two outs and trailing by two runs. F1 delivers the pitch with four seconds on the clock. B1 hits a ground ball to F6 who throws B1 out at first base. Time expired after B1 made contact with the ball but before F6’s throw reaches first base.
- A: The umpires should start the seventh inning.
 - B: At the time the third out was made, time had expired and the game is over.
 - C: The umpire should go into the Tie-Breaker in the top of the seventh inning.

Benefits of an ASA Umpire



1 **\$2,000,000 per occurrence of LIABILITY INSURANCE—** This policy covers you in the event you are sued, and adjudged by a court of law for bodily injury, personal injury or property damage to others while officiating at ASA sanctioned activities, games, leagues and tournaments involving ASA registered teams. Coverage is also provided for defense costs to include legal fees, court costs and investigative costs.

2 **EXCESS ACCIDENT MEDICAL EXPENSE INSURANCE—** Accidental injury arising out of the amateur softball activities of the umpire is covered. These include ASA sanctioned activities, games, leagues and tournaments involving ASA registered teams, practices, clinics, including direct and uninterrupted travel to and from the site of the activity. The medical expense coverage is provided on an excess basis. This means that this insurance comes into play only after other group or individual medical insurance or any other health plan has paid out its benefits. Payments are limited to the usual and customary charges for reasonable and necessary medical services. The policy contains a surgical schedule which sets forth dollar maximums for specific surgical procedures. Thus, some medical expenses may not be covered in full.

Policy is subject to 90/10 co-insurance. There is a \$25,000 sub limit of Accident insurance coverage for umpires while traveling to and from an assignment.

3 **INSURANCE COVERAGE WHILE OFFICIATING OTHER SPORTS** ASA umpire associations, ASA Commissioners, or UIC's can now purchase accident and liability coverage, as well as game fee reimbursement as a result of injury, for their umpires who officiate other sports. Game Fee Reimbursement would also apply to ASA softball games. Coverage is only \$22, but must be purchased with a minimum of 10 umpires. (Premium is \$220 minimum).

4 As part of the registration fee, each umpire receives insurance coverage, The Official Rules of Softball Umpire Edition and quarterly issue of *Balls and Strikes Online*.

5 Because an umpire is registered with the ASA, they can obtain rule interpretations, attend ASA rule clinics and the regular and advanced National Umpire Schools.

6 An umpire uniform and leisure wear program is available to each registered umpire. Included are clothing, souvenirs and publications. Request the new catalog today.

7 Only ASA registered umpires are selected to officiate in metro, state, regional and national championships. There are now more than 100 ASA national championships.

8 Only ASA registered umpires are eligible to apply for ISF (International Softball Federation) certification which offers the opportunity to umpire in World Championships, Pan American Games and other international events.

9 ASA Umpires can qualify to umpire in ISF Events held at beautiful ISF Headquarters in Plant City, FL.

10 ASA Umpires are eligible to apply for the medals program available in blue (3 yrs.), bronze (5 yrs.), silver (15 yrs.) and gold (20 yrs.), just for being a registered ASA Umpire. A complete line of leisure wear styles is available, along with trophies, plaques, watches, etc.

11 ASA Umpires are eligible to apply for the National Indicator Fraternity and be recognized for their umpiring experience in a registry in the ASA Hall of Fame and Umpire Manual.

12 Qualified ASA Umpires can apply for Elite Umpire status within the ASA. Those qualified individuals will receive a lapel pin, a navy ASA/USA "Elite" cap, membership card, framed certificate and their name listed in a registry in the ASA Hall of Fame.

13 Only through the ASA program are training aides available for umpires and umpire organizations. These aides include an animated mechanics DVD, Clinic guide, Power Point presentations, instructional video cassettes, the umpire examination, meeting quizzes and the case book on CD.
